


- 1. Tuition and Fees

- Scholarships
 - Institutional
 - Private
- Federal Financial Aid
 - Grants
 - Loans
 - Federal Work Study
- Family Funds
- 401K and College Savings Accounts
- Payment Plan Options
- Private Loans



SCHOLARSHIPS

Institutional

- Funding from the university
 - What are the eligibility requirements?
 - How to apply?
 - Are these scholarships renewable?

Private

- Funding from outside organizations, not university-specific
 - How do I receive these scholarship awards?
 - Are these scholarships renewable?
 - Do I receive the scholarship money or does the university?



ACU SCHOLARSHIPS*


- Scholarships are based on a variety of criteria including:

 - Christian School Attendance
 - Homeschool Attendance
 - Church and Christian Ministries
 - Church Matching
 - Financial Need

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

- What do you need?
 - Current tax information
 - Social Security Number
 - Driver's license number
 - FSA ID
 - Allows students and parents to identify themselves electronically to access Federal Student Aid websites (Details on next slide)
- Application available at: www.FAFSA.gov



CREATE YOUR FSA ID

- Navigate to: <u>https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm</u>
- 2. Create a username and password
- 3. Enter your personal Information
- 4. Enter your Contact Information
- 5. Select Challenge Questions
- 6. Complete the form



INDEPENDENT VS. DEPENDENT STATUS

Independent

- Must be 24 or older
- Enlisted or veteran of the U.S. military
- Married
- Have children or dependents
- Working toward your master's or doctoral degree
- Deceased parents or ward of the state
- Unaccompanied youth or homeless

Dependent

If you do not meet the above requirements, you are considered "dependent"

Note: FAFSA will guide students through process of determining this status

ENTER TAX INFORMATION

- IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT)
 - Enter personal info
 - Use DRT to import most recent tax information
 - Check for accuracy

<u>Note:</u> DRT is most accurate way to have accurate FAFSA information and awards and we encourage you use this tool

WHO RECEIVES MY INFO?

- Your FAFSA can be sent to up to 10 colleges or universities
 - You must select all schools you are interested in apply to
- Up to two weeks to process the FAFSA
- ACU FAFSA Code: 007113
- Follow-up and send information that is requested!

ELECTRONICALLY SIGN

- Use your FSA ID to electronically sign your FAFSA
- Parent will also use their own FSA ID to electronically sign FAFSA

CONFIRMATION PAGE

- Confirmation Number
- EFC (Estimated Family Contribution)
- Notifications
 - Verification
