

## Professional Licensure General Disclosures – Education Programs

Updated October 2024

Arizona Christian University's certified education programs may lead to professional licensure or certification. The table below represents the results of the university's reasonable, good-faith efforts to determine whether its certified education programs:

- meet the applicable professional licensure or certification education requirements,
- do not meet the applicable professional licensure or certification education requirements,
- or whether the university has been unable to determine if its certified education programs meet the applicable professional requirements licensure or certification education requirements.

The National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) publishes information for out-of-state applicants for teacher certification in jurisdictions that participate in the NASDTEC Interstate Agreement. Graduates of ACU's certified education programs who go on to obtain Arizona teacher certification may be able to obtain a reciprocal certification from the NASDTEC-participating jurisdictions.
